

**Developments in Sudan**  
**During the period from 2-8 March 2026**  
**Report No. (10/2026)**

## **First: Activities of the Sovereign Council and the Executive Organs:**

### **1. Activities of the Sovereign Council:**

a. His Excellency the Chairman of the Sovereign Council, 1Lt. Gen Abdel Fattah al-Burhan, met the Liberian Foreign Minister, Sarah Beysole, where he affirmed that the government is efficiently carrying out its duties from the capital, Khartoum, which has become safe and stable. H.E. al-Burhan also held a series of telephone calls with the leaders of Jordan, Saudi Arabia, Kuwait, and Bahrain, emphasizing Sudan's solidarity with them in light of the ongoing war in the Middle East. H.E. al-Burhan further chaired the regular meeting of the Security and Defense Council to review the security situation, commending the role of the mobile command in the Dignity War and affirming the government's commitment to preventing any abuse of Sudanese citizens or the exploitation of freedom to harm the state. H.E. al-Burhan also shared an Iftar with citizens in the Al-Zakiab and Al-Haj Yousef areas of Khartoum North.

b. Mr. Malik Agar, Vice chairman of the Sovereign Council, met the Liberian Foreign Minister Sarah Beysole and briefed her on the political and humanitarian situation in Sudan, the internationally documented human rights violations, and the extent of the damage to the country's infrastructure. He called for solidarity among the peoples of the African continent and support for Sudan's position in resolving African problems within the African Union. He also urged Liberia to play a greater role in helping Sudan regain its seat in the African Union.

c. Lt. Gen. Shams El-Din Kabbashi, a member of the Sovereign Council, met the Liberian Foreign Minister Sarah Beysole. The meeting addressed strengthening bilateral relations and issues of common interest between the two countries, as well as regional developments and the war in Sudan. The Liberian Minister affirmed her country's desire to enhance cooperation and hold consultations regarding Liberia's role in the UN Security Council.

d. Lt. Gen. Yasser Abdel Rahman Al-Atta, a member of the Sovereign Council, announced that the next phase will witness the integration of all supporting forces in the Battle of Dignity into the Armed Forces and other regular forces.

e. Ms. Dr. Nawara Abu Mohammed Mohammed Tahir, a member of the Sovereign Council, attended the annual Iftar (fast-breaking meal) of the Rural Patients' Friends Association in Port Sudan. She praised the association's role in supporting

vulnerable groups and urged the establishment of branches in all Sudanese states to further its humanitarian goals. She also visited the "Iftar for Travelers" project of the Accident Street Association, emphasizing the importance of social solidarity in Sudanese society. Furthermore, she inaugurated a Qatari Red Crescent convoy in Port Sudan, in the presence of the Qatari Ambassador and the Director of the Qatari Red Crescent office in Sudan. The convoy included shelter assistance for those affected in the states of North Kordofan, White Nile, and River Nile. She commended the humanitarian role in achieving peace and social stability.

#### **Fourth: Military and Security Situation:**

##### **6. Movements of the Armed Forces and Other Regular Forces:**

a. The Armed Forces and their supporting forces managed to recapture the city of Bara, areas of Umm Shudaira, Wadi Umm Qurood, and the Adarib Forest in North Kordofan State from the rebel militia. This resulted in the killing of (31) rebel militia elements, the wounding of more than (130) others, the destruction of a number of combat vehicles, and the capture of (31) other combat vehicles.

b. The Armed Forces and their supporting forces repelled an attack by the rebel militia on the city of Dilling in South Kordofan State. This resulted in the killing of (31) rebel militia elements, the wounding of others, the destruction of (8) combat vehicles, and the capture of (8) other vehicles.

c. The Armed Forces and their supporting forces repelled an attack by the rebel militia on the Al-Kuweik and Hajar Al-Dilib areas of Dilling, South Kordofan State. The attack resulted in the death and injury of a number of rebel militia elements, the destruction of 21 combat vehicles, and the capture of two other combat vehicles.

##### **6. Violations by the Rapid Support Forces (RSF) Terrorist Militia:**

a. On March 1, 2026, the rebel militia targeted the Al-Ubayyid Stadium, the Nile and Bashair Petroleum Pumping Stations, the Al-Kharsana School, the Zakat Bureau building, the Ophthalmology Department at Al-Ubayyid Teaching Hospital, and the British Hospital in North Kordofan State with 26 strategic drone missiles. This resulted in the death and injury of a number of civilians and partial destruction of the hospital buildings and the Zakat Bureau building.

- b. On March 1, 2026, the rebel militia and the SPLM-N (Al-Hilu faction) targeted Dilling Teaching Hospital in South Kordofan State with six strategic drone missiles, causing damage to the hospital.
- c. On March 2, 2026, the rebel militia and the SPLM-N (al-Hilu faction) shelled the city of Dilling in South Kordofan State with 52 artillery shells, resulting in the death and injury of a number of civilians.
- d. On March 3-4, 2026, the rebel militia targeted the stadium in El Obeid, the El Obeid electricity substation, and an oil factory in North Kordofan State with 12 strategic drone missiles, resulting in a power outage in the city.
- e. On March 3-4, 2026, the rebel militia and the SPLM-N (al-Hilu faction) targeted the city of Dilling in South Kordofan State with 18 suicide drones and 54 artillery shells, resulting in the death of 13 civilians and the injury of 19 others.
- f. On March 4, 2026, the rebel militia targeted the cities of Kosti and Rabak in White Nile State with six strategic drone missiles, resulting in the destruction of three fuel trucks and two houses, and partial damage to two other trucks and a fuel station on the Rabak-Sinnar road.
- g. On March 5, 2026, the rebel militia attacked the Umm Kridim area in North Kordofan State, resulting in the death and injury of a number of civilians.
- h. On March 5, 2026, the rebel militia targeted the city of El Obeid with seventeen strategic drone missiles, resulting in partial damage to the railway workshop warehouses, the cafeteria and the internal hall of the Dalas school, the Qadir school, the Al-Ablaj Flour Company warehouses, and a house in the Sharjah neighborhood.
1. On March 2, 2026, the rebel militia and the SPLM-N (al-Hilu faction) shelled the market in Dilling, South Kordofan State, resulting in the death of 25 civilians and injuries to several others.
